Spend the quarter studying in the great capital city of London. London is a major political, financial and cultural center and through the WCCCSA study abroad program, you can take in its museums, famous theaters, concert halls, sporting grounds and historic buildings with a subsidized program of cultural activities.

INCLUDED

- One-time round-trip group transfers between the airport and accommodation on program arrival and departure dates.
- Accommodation in a twin room in a homestay. Continental breakfast is provided five days a week (Monday through Friday) and dinner four days a week (Monday through Thursday), and students will have kitchen access for the preparation of any other meals.
- London Transport travel pass, valid for unlimited use on the buses and underground trains in travel zones 1-3.
- Two-day orientation program including a meeting with AIFS staff; workshops on cultural differences, safety/security and travel; information packet; welcome reception and half-day guided sightseeing tour of London by private coach.
- Subsidized program of optional cultural events, including 5 Friday day trips (to Oxford, Stonehenge and Salisbury, Bath, Brighton and Stratford-Upon-Avon), 4 theater events, a football or rugby match and a walking tour.
- Access to the wireless-enabled AIFS Student Center and the services of the AIFS Program Coordinator and Student Advisors for information, personal advising/counseling and 24-hour emergency contact service.

- Use of the student computer lab located in the AIFS Student Center with free Internet access and printing facilities.
- Membership of the University of London Union, which gives access to the Union facilities, subsidized rates to sports facilities and the opportunity to join University of London clubs and societies.
- International Student Identity Card.
- \$50 non-refundable application fee.
- Student medical and program fee refund insurance policies.

Students will enroll for 15 credits to include the mandatory British Life and Culture course taught by a local adjunct lecturer, focusing on historical, political, economic and cultural aspects of contemporary Britain.

FEES

Based on an enrollment of 25 or more participants, for the services specified above, the fee per person is \$7,395.

This fee excludes airfare, a \$250 refundable damage deposit, optional insurance upgrades, passport or visa fees, meals other than those listed, personal expenses, tuition, textbooks, additional field trips or excursions required by the WCCCSA faculty and anything not specified.

These fees are guaranteed not to change as a result of fluctuations in the \$ exchange rate.

OPTIONAL AIRFARE PACKAGE

On a space-available basis, students may purchase the optional airfare package consisting of round-trip flights between Seattle and London for an additional \$TBC excluding mandatory

U.S. government and airline-imposed departure taxes, fees and fuel surcharges of \$TBC (subject to change) for which students will be billed separately.

A minimum of 12 participants must purchase the flight for it to be offered.

OPTIONAL SCOTLAND EXCURSION

An optional 4-day, 3-night excursion to Scotland will be offered for a supplemental fee of \$595 per participant. Included in the price is a round-trip train ticket between London and Edinburgh, 3 nights hostel accommodation with breakfast included (1 night each in Edinburgh, Loch Ness and on the Isle of Skye), a 3-day guided bus tour to the highlands and islands of Scotland, 2 evening meals and the services of an AIFS staff member throughout the excursion.
